2023 saw a new era of netball for Waratah Netball Club with our inclusion into the top tier of Newcastle Netball – the Tri-Series competition. We have been working behind the scenes for many years to make it to the top level of the Newcastle competition, so to actually crack into it is an amazing achievement for everyone who worked hard to make this happen. There were never any expectations on the amazing group of people who put their hands up to play in these 3 teams in our inaugural year – and next year there won't be many either. The step up to TS is a hard one – playing against established teams whom have had many years experience at this level (having been a part of the Greater Bank Championship and 2HD Open grades previous to the establishment of this series) and having the luxury of pulling players from a vast array of teams means it was always going to be hard for the Waratah players. But they played like champions, held their heads high on the tough days, and celebrated like they won the Grand Final when they won their first game! Our Opens Sabres won the inaugural Tri-Series Plate which is played out between the lowest 4 teams of the table in each of the 3 grades, with all 3 of our teams having at least one win this year. Whilst not many would think that wasn't much to be pleased with, I think it is the most wonderful achievement.... You should all be proud of yourselves! You have held your heads high, worked hard behind the scenes, and made Waratah proud at the highest level. I can't wait to see where 2024 takes us!

But 2023 wasn't only about the TS teams – we had 7 junior/cadet teams this year; an unexpected growth on last season after losing 2 established teams. A new 7s team (and weren't they adorable! I can't believe my children were ever that small!), as well as a few returning but mostly new players in our second 10s team. The rest of our junior teams were a mix of returning and new players. It is great to see the growth in our junior ranks and players who have taken time off return to us, and how well the new players fit into our Club. This is making the future bright for a small Club like ours.

Our 13 years Capris had some personnel changes this year, and welcomed some new faces as well. They came together and ended 2023 as Grand Final winners!! Congratulations to you all on your achievement © Our 10s Ravens made the Final, which is a wonderful achievement for a team in their first year of competition. These girls are bringing it every season and I have no doubt they will get the title in the next few years. Our 17s team Spitfires were a mix of players who won their Grand Final in 2022 and who were asked to step up a level and play in a higher age group. The growth of this team, and the way the younger players stood up and learnt and found a new way to develop their netball was wonderful to see. This hard work and determination not only brought a Grand Final win, but saw them go through season 2023 undefeated!! This is a tough thing to achieve, and the girls did it with hard work, commitment, and determination. Congratulations Spitfires!

Most of our senior teams were returning Waratah players from either last year or seasons past, but we saw an influx of new players as well, including a whole team who moved to us from the Port Stephens area! #Hereifyouneed is a catchphrase pivotal to netball, and this team showed that being there when needed brings results, finishing with a Grand Final win in their first year with Waratah! They had some dominating wins to also go through the season undefeated - I hope your first year with Waratah was a memorable one! We had 3 other teams make it as far as the Finals this year – Div 2 Maes, Div 3 Hornets, and Div 7 Titans. Considering the injuries and illness that swamped these teams this year (especially the Hornets, whom had 5 players out for most of the season, as well as a casual who came to help out rupturing her Achilles in the first 2 minutes of her second fill-in game!) making the Finals is remarkable. Great work teams!

To all the other teams who made up the Waratah family in season 2023 – thank you! Thank you for coming to play with us, coming back to play with us, bringing new people to our Club to play, giving us a chance to show you what Waratah is all about, and displaying our Club Values throughout the season. Without you playing, we don't have a Club. Without the parents we don't have a Club. Without the volunteers who

coach, manage, umpire, strategize and plan we don't have a Club. Without any of you WE DON'T HAVE A CLUB – SO THANK YOU!!!!!!!!

Registrar's Report - 2023

Registration. 2023 saw the second year of the PlayHQ registration system. Registration was relatively simple once the setup by the Registrar had been completed. There was one registration day held at Mayfield West Bowling Club that was well supported by committee members and was a very good opportunity to welcome many new players. NNA support for the registration process, including tranfers, casuals, and de-registrations, was very good.

Membership. 171 players and 13 officials registered, forming 16 teams (10 x Senior (including 17s Spitfires), and 5 x Junior teams. This also included five NetSetGo Netta players. This was a significant increase in players (128 players in 2022).

Casual and Late Registrations. All registrations were conducted iaw Club Policy *Late Registration Policy*. There were no significant issues, and the NNA Registrar was once again very helpful.

Coaches and Managers. Coaches were registered as Non Playing Members if they were not already registered as players. However, not all managers were registered although this did not pose a significant impediment.

Life Membership. In 2023 one member met the criteria for Life Membership as articulated in the Club constitution, and this was presented to **Cat Levey** (Tri-series Champs) on the Presentation Evening.

Committee Positions. All 2023 committee positions were recorded in MyClubMate. These records are required to comply with Dept of Fair Trading requirements to record all Committee members.

Other recording. The Club Registration Spreadsheet has been updated and is in *OneDrive/2023/Registrar/"Rego Data 2003-2023"*. A download of MCM data has been stored in *OneDrive/2023/Registrar/"221005 MCM Club Database.xlsx"*, and "231005 MCM Club Officials.xlsx".

On 06 August 2023, the Strategy Committee reviewed the 2023 season with the intent to develop options for the Committee to consider for the next few years. The general feeling was that the Club was in sound shape, with clear goals, and a focus on the future. While there were opportunities for improvement, the Club membership seemed satisfied with the performance of the Management Committee and the Club itself.

A 'Request for Feedback" was distributed to all Club members. While the questions were not specifically focused on the Club objectives and/or goals, the feedback was useful in compiling the general feelings in the Club. Unfortunately there were far fewer responses than hoped (less than 15%), however there were several suggestions for improvement which were passed on to the Committee. Notwithstanding the areas in which the Club could improve, the comments were generally very positive. Some responses to the question "What did the Club do well?" area as follows:

Always good sportsmanship at Waratah - way better than the attitudes of other clubs this year. Teams are very social and friendly with one another, so created a good environment.

Great team community

Waratah feels like a family, the social events to meet other teams is amazing. We have a really good culture and everyone supporting each other is amazing. The discount for coaches at the beginning and end of the season is a nice incentive as well.

Welcoming new players, friendly and supportive coaches and managers

Strategy Committee Recommendations

At the 06 August meeting, the Strategy Committee convened and developed several main themes for discussion on topics such as, for example: getting more people to the Bowlo, our media presence, advertising our role, and assessing our performance.
